RESOLUTION NO. 15-09

RE: DESIGNATION OF THE FREDERICK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AS THE PRIMARY LAW ENFORCEMENT UNIT PURSUANT TO ANN. CODE OF MD., BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE, TITLES 12, 17 AND 20.

The County Council of Frederick County, Maryland, (the "Council") recognizes that Titles 12, 17 and 20 of the Business Regulation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland require the governing body of each county to designate, by resolution, the primary law enforcement unit responsible to, among other things, receive records relating to the activities of persons licensed in Frederick County as: secondhand precious metal object dealers and pawnbrokers, junk dealers and scrap metal processors, and buyers of electronic devices using automated purchasing machine(s).

The County Executive and the Sheriff of Frederick County have agreed that the Frederick County Sheriff's Office should be the primary law enforcement unit responsible to receive such records, and perform other related activities with respect to those licensed to engage in these activities in Frederick County, Maryland.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF FREDERICK COUNTY, MARYLAND, that at the request of the County Executive and the Sheriff, the Frederick County Sheriff's Office is hereby designated as the primary law enforcement unit in Frederick County, Maryland, pursuant to Titles 12, 17 and 20 of the Business Regulation Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland which regulate the activities of secondhand precious metal object dealers and pawnbrokers, junk dealers and scrap metal processors, and buyers of electronic devices using automated purchasing machine(s).


AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution is intended to supercede Resolution 11-06.
