2. AGENCY COMMENTS / AGENDA BRIEFING

To move forward with making a recommendation, Mr. Horn suggested that the Commission focus on major components of the Plan, and not overburden itself on verbiage, formatting, etc. during the workshops, so that major concepts can be prepared and ready for public inspection. Mr. Hopwood noted that language should be written for the average person to comprehend. Instead of workshops spending too much time on reviewing verbiage, suggestions could be “red-lined” and communicated via email.

3. LIVABLE FREDERICK WORK SESSION


The work session opened defining the structure of the plan; is it readable, workable and approachable for the public?

- Housing design – building costs, universal design, ADA requirements, accessibility design

- Tradition – expression, preservation, maintaining Frederick County distinction in its history, identity which is critical to its economy, through tourism
