Many programs can help **reduce waste**, save space in our landfill, contribute to the local economy, and conserve resources- all while making economical goods available to local families. The following listings are for groups that are involved in purchasing, reselling or otherwise reusing unwanted goods. - **Animal Welfare League of Frederick County**

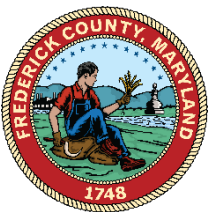
- **swap.com**
