## **REVISED - Boyers Mill Road Bridge Overnight Lane Closure**

FREDERICK, MD – The Frederick County Office of Transportation Engineering advises the public that the overnight single-lane closure on Boyers Mill Road at the bridge over Lake Linganore scheduled for Sunday, November 13, 2016 has been revised and is no longer needed. A daytime single-lane closure on Boyers Mill Road at the bridge site is scheduled for **Monday, November 14, 2016 and Tuesday, November 15, 2016 between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.** during the normal lane closure period for the project. The daytime single-lane closure will be open to one lane of traffic through the bridge construction site using a temporary flagging operation. The bridge site will be open to two-way, two-lane traffic by the end of each working day. This lane closure will allow the contractor, Concrete General, to remove temporary traffic barrier foundations and construct base paving on the northbound lane.

Beginning Monday, November 14, 2016, motorists are alerted to a temporary gravel riding surface that will be in place in the northbound lane at the south approach of the bridge site. The gravel riding surface will be in place until the northbound lane is paved. The asphalt paving operation is scheduled for Tuesday, November 15, 2016, weather permitting. Longer than normal delays at the bridge can be expected during this time frame. Unforeseen circumstances may require the temporary bridge lane closure to be in service longer than anticipated.

It is strongly advised for area residents to plan their trips accordingly to allow adequate time to reach their destinations. The county requests residents to be patient during this crucial yet critical phase of the project. Frederick County and the contractor will make every effort to minimize traffic delays during this time frame. The county sincerely apologizes in advance for any inconvenience that this may cause, and appreciates the public's cooperation.
