The County Council of Frederick County, Maryland, finds it necessary and appropriate to amend Chapter 1-5 (Animals and Fowl), Section 26 (A)(1) of the Frederick County Code to reduce from ten to four, the number of hours a dog may be fastened, chained, tied, or restrained to any stationary or inanimate object for the purpose of confinement.

§ 1-5-26 PROPER RESTRAINT, SHELTER, PROTECTION AND CARE FOR DOGS.

(A) *Restraint requirement*

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to tether, fasten, chain, tie, restrain or cause a dog to be fastened, chained, tied, or restrained to any stationary or inanimate object by means of a rope, chain, strap, or other physical restraint for the purpose of confinement for more than [ten hours] four (4) hours, cumulatively in any 24-hour period.
