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LIEUTENANT KEITH ROBESON RETIRES

On September 28, 2018, after 27 years of dedicated service, Lieutenant Keith Robeson will retire from the Frederick County Sheriff's office.

Lt. Robeson began his employment with the Frederick County Sheriff's Office in August of 1991. He attended the 35th class of the Frederick City Police Officer Training Academy, graduating in March of 1992.

Lt. Robeson was assigned to Patrol Operations following his graduation in March of 1992. He served as a Patrol Team Deputy, a Field Training Officer, a Motorcycle Deputy, and a member of the Special Services Team (SWAT).

In March of 1996, Lt. Robeson entered the K-9 Unit where he remained through October of 2005. Lt. Robeson served as a K-9 Handler, K-9 Trainer, and K-9 Unit Supervisor. He was promoted to Corporal in January of 1999, and promoted to Sergeant in December of 2000. Lt. Robeson handled two cross-trained patrol and narcotics detection dogs, Agbar and Niko, during his 9 ½ years in the K-9 Unit. He trained many other K-9 teams from the Frederick County Sheriff's Office and several allied agencies in the areas of patrol functions, narcotics detection, and explosives detection.

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Lt. Robeson was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in October of 2005. Since that time, his assignments have included Criminal Investigations Commander, Patrol Shift Commander, Patrol Administrative Lieutenant, and Judicial Services Commander.
