1-19-8.491. BODYWORK

The establishment of a new Bodywork use shall be permitted only if the following requirements are met:

(A) Prior to applying for a Building Permit, a Zoning Verification letter must be submitted to the Zoning Administrator which includes:

1. A description of the business,
2. A list of current employees, and
3. Copies of all required licenses from the State of Maryland for each listed employee or, for uses that do not require a license, verification of professional training.

(B) The owner or operator of a Bodywork use shall file an annual report, as required by the Zoning Administrator, which includes an updated list of employees and copies of all required State licenses or verification of professional training.

(C) A Bodywork use shall not be used as a place of human habitation.

(D) Bodywork instruction may only be provided:

1. to individuals who are enrolled in a bodywork training program recognized by the Maryland Higher Education Commission; and
2. in accordance with applicable State law and regulations governing bodywork licensure and education.

(E) The Zoning Administrator, or designee, is authorized pursuant to 1-19-2.100(B) to conduct periodic inspections of a Bodywork use to verify compliance with this section.

(F) A violation of this section will result in the suspension or revocation of the Zoning Certificate approval.

§ 1-19-11.100. DEFINITIONS.

24 **BODYWORK.** The practice of therapeutic touching or manipulation of another person's body by
25 rubbing, stroking, kneading or tapping with one's hands or another part of the body.] The practitioner
26 of using one's hands or another part of the body to apply pressure on an individual's body or bare
27 feet to affect the electromagnetic energy, energetic field, or energy meridians of the human
28 body.] The term **BODYWORK** does not apply to:

29 |(a) An individual with a license, registration, or other approval issued by the State of
30 Maryland under State Board of Massage Therapy Examiners to provide massage therapy under §
31 6-101 of the Health Occupations Article;|

32 (b) a) An athletic trainer who:

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1. Is certified by a nationally recognized athletic trainer certification agency identified by the Director and works under the supervision of a physician, while functioning in the athletic trainer's professional capacity;

2. Is employed by an accredited educational institution, while performing professional duties at that institution; or

3. Is employed by a professional sports team, while treating members of that team; or

[(c) A business in which every person who provides services is a certified massage therapist or registered massage practitioner under state law.]

[d] A professionally trained reflexologist as identified through the use of a stand-alone, non-profit, psychometrically valid national testing process.]

BODYWORK ESTABLISHMENT. Any business that provides advertises bodywork services or where any employee, agent, or contractor, who is not a certified massage therapist or registered massage practitioner under state law, performs bodywork on an individual.]

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
