The County Council of Frederick County, Maryland, finds it necessary and appropriate to amend the Frederick County Code to establish residency preferences in § 1-2-135 Membership, Meetings, and Organization of the Interagency Internal Audit Authority (IIAA).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF FREDERICK COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Frederick County Code be, and it is hereby, amended as shown on the attached Exhibit 1.

§ 1-2-135. MEMBERSHIP, MEETINGS, AND ORGANIZATION.

(A) The IIAA shall be composed of seven members:

(1) a member of the Board of Education,

(2) a member of the Frederick Community College Board of Trustees,

(3) a member of the Frederick County Council,

(4) four members of the public, of which Frederick County, Maryland
residency is preferred.

(B) The members of the public:

(1) shall possess expertise in accounting, auditing and internal control,

(2) must be nominated by the IIAA and appointed by the Frederick County
Council,

(3) serve four-year terms commencing on a staggered basis,

(4) are eligible to serve two consecutive four-year terms and are subsequently
eligible for reappointment if at least one year has elapsed since the end of their last term, and

(5) if appointed to a partial term, are eligible to serve two additional consecutive
terms.
